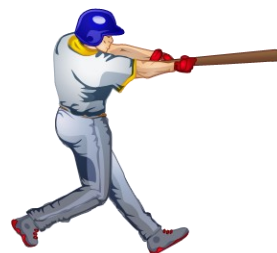

Jaycees Kenya Project 2011

Be a part of providing education to young leaders in a Kenya slum community by giving to the Jaycees Kenya Project 2011!

The Charlotte Junior Chamber has partnered with The Positive World LLC to send an estimated value of \$100,000 worth of books and school uniforms to Nairobi, Kenya. These resources will be handled by a non-profit organization called Slumcode Group which supports a slum community of 54,787 men and 51,532 women where crime, alcohol, drugs and AIDS are daily challenges. They

have developed a resource center within walking distance of the Huruma Slums of Nairobi, expanding the educational resources available and providing training and employment for 15 young people.

As a board, we are very excited about this project and invite you as a fellow North Carolina chapter take part in the success. We are raising \$5,000 towards the cost of shipping a container of supplies by July 1, 2011 and ask you to consider a \$100 donation. Corporate sponsorships are already coming in but we would like
